INTRODUCTION

Bordeaux Montaigne University has a strong international orientation. Consequently, we offer a variety of courses taught in foreign languages, mainly in English and Spanish. International students can have access to these courses if they have a language level equivalent to at least B2 under the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

This brochure is meant to give you some information about the content, duration and ECTS credits allotted to these courses.

Please note that our university organizes its courses according to the LMD European System (Licence-Master-Doctorate). Courses are therefore divided into Undergraduate (Licence) and Graduate Programs (Master 1st and 2nd year). Graduate courses have a limited capacity and access conditions are determined by professors.

The winter semester starts in September and ends in December while the spring semester starts in January and ends in early May.
